

## Department 102 – Jr. Beef / Dual Purpose Livestock

### Superintendents

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**Weigh in: Tuesday from 1:00 PM until finish, approximately 2:00 PM. Clubs will be released at the scale one at a time to stop lines and confusion.**

**Judging: Thursday 8 AM**

### Rules/Guidelines:

**Notice: All animals must be identified (ear tag or health papers, tattoo) with Department Superintendent before being unloaded. Health papers will be kept on file during the Fair in the Livestock Office and turned over for the Fair Office to maintain for a 5-year period. Failure to abide by this rule will result in immediate removal of animals from grounds and forfeiture of show rights.**

1. The Wisconsin County, District & State Animal Health Rules & Regulations will be followed.
2. Market Division Animals will be judged before Breed Divisions. All beef animals must be dehorned.
3. Animals can start arriving Tuesday at 10:00 AM and MUST be in place by 12:00 PM.
4. Market Division entries must be castrated males, or market beef heifers.
5. Each Exhibitor is allowed no more than 2 Steers or 2 market heifers at the Fair.
6. An Overall Grand Champion and Reserve Overall Champion will be chosen from all Champions and Reserve Champions.
7. To be eligible for the Auction, you must fulfill the requirements of the Sale Committee & Animal Science Association.
8. Homebred and Raised Market Division animals will be recognized at the sale. To qualify, the exhibitor or immediate family must have owned the mother of the animal entered at the time of breeding. The immediate family is defined as a brother, sister, parent/guardian or grandparent.
9. The updated Uniform Premium List allows payment of premiums on a maximum of three animals per exhibitor in all market divisions under subsection.
10. No one is allowed in the show ring except people approved by the Superintendent.
11. Only exhibitors, family members (Parents, Siblings, Grandparents, Aunt or Uncle) and Washington County leaders will be allowed to fit animals for the market show. No outside youth or adults will be allowed to fit/work on the animal prior to the animal being shown.
12. No fans allowed behind the animals. All fans must be hung to the side of the animals pointed south toward the swine barn.

Registration Deadline: June 10, 2025

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13. Tack area is limited. Only feed, 1-2 bales of hay/bedding and show box/ tack. No chutes are to be left set up under the overhangs unless in use. They can be stored on their side to take up minimal space. **Superintendent will designate tack areas for clubs.**

## Division A – Dairy Breed Steers

Class No:

Division Rules:

Dairy Steers must have only dairy breed blood (Holstein, Guernsey, Brown Swiss, Jersey, Ayrshire, and Milking Shorthorn)

## Division B – Crossbred Dairy Steers

Division Rules:

Crossbred Dairy Steers would have any % of dairy breed blood in the animal not listed in Dairy Breed Steers above, such as Montbeliarde, Swedish Red, Normande, and many more. They can't have any beef breed blood. They must be entered here.

### Division Rules: C,D, E, F, G, H, I, X :

Market Steers will be divided into breed division if there are four or more entries qualifying for the listed breed divisions. In order to be entered or shown in a breed division, the animal must be able to be recorded by the Breed Association (check with your breed's association for the specifications). The animal does not have to be registered, but you need to show the superintendent the paperwork you would send to the Breed Association. If less than four animals are entered in a breed division, those animals will be moved into the "Any Other Breed Division". If eight animals or more are shown in a division, it will be divided in light weight, medium and heavy weight divisions, depending on the number of entries and their weights. Homebred and raised animals will be recognized at the sale. To qualify, the exhibitor or immediate family must have owned the mother of the animal entered at the time of breeding. The immediate family is defined as brother, sister, parent/guardian or grandparent.

### Division Rules J, K, L, M, N, O, P, Q :

#### **Bulls must be registered.**

- A Junior Calf is one born on or after January 1<sup>st</sup> of the exhibit year. The calf must be at least 4 months old at the time of exhibit.
- A Senior Calf is one whose date of birth is between September 1 and December 31 of the year preceding the exhibit year.
- A Summer Yearling is one whose date of birth is between May 1 and August 31 of the year preceding the exhibit year.
- A Junior Yearling is one whose date of birth is between January 1 and April 30 of the year preceding the exhibit year.
- A Senior Yearling is one whose date of birth is between September 1 and December 31 of the second year preceding the exhibit year.
- A 2-Year-Old and older cow is one born before September 1 of the second year preceding the exhibit year and which has calved during the past year.

### Division Awards:

**Champion Male – by Breeds, any age, ribbon only.**

**Champion Female – Purebred or grade by Breeds, any age, ribbon only.**

## Division R – Best Group of 4 Females (Beef)

### Class No:

1. Group of 4 animals of Dual-Purpose breeds.  
This Group may be of one or more than one breed.
2. Group of 4 animals of any or all beef type breeds.  
This group may be of any or all Beef breeds.

### Division “R” Rules:

Entries must be made under the name of a youth organization. Premiums will be paid only to the youth group of which the exhibitors are members. Entries must be from at least two herds, separately owned, by exhibitors who belong to one FFA Chapter or one 4H Club. A Club or Chapter may make more than one entry.

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## Division S – Performance Steer (Any Breed)

### Class No:

1. Performance Steer (1<sup>st</sup> Steer)
2. Performance Steer (2<sup>nd</sup> Steer)

### Division “S” Rules:

Performance Steer Class emphasizes production agriculture and the exhibitor’s ability to select and raise steers which will be evaluated on and overall final placing, based on Live Visual Appraisal and Ultrasound Carcass Evaluation.

Live Show Component: **Steers will be shown on Thursday.**

Ultrasound Carcass Component: Steer carcasses are evaluated via ultrasound. **\*\* Oil will be applied to your steer for accurate readings. If you prefer not to participate, please don’t enter this class.**

Division “U” Rules:

This entry is for CLUBS or CHAPTERS. An exhibitor should check with their Club or Chapter before **June 10<sup>th</sup>** to be sure they are entered. An exhibitor does NOT need to list this division on their entry form. Premiums will be awarded for keeping the animals on exhibit in neat appearance, the feed, straw, haybales and boxes in the proper place and the walkways in the barn are in good order and appearance. Any decorations erected, including barn cards, will be considered in the judging. All decorations must be removed before any premiums are paid. Judging to be done at the Superintendent’s discretion.
