#### Rules/Guidelines:

- Demonstrations by junior and intermediate members should be 5-10 minutes, senior members 10-15 minutes.
- A member may enter only one demonstration.
- Recommended poster size 14"x22".

## Division D – Speaking

Class No:

1. A collection of two or more items that document how you planned your speech. These could include speech planning worksheet, list of references, speech outline, and note cards, etc.
2. A poster of stress reduction tips and suggestions for dealing with speech anxiety.
3. A cassette or videotape of you practicing your speech, with a short note describing what you noticed when you listened to the tape.

## Division E – Communications

Class No:

1. A photo exhibit, scrapbook or collage about the things you discovered from the person you interviewed.
2. An exhibit including photos and any other items you've gathered that relate to the project.
3. A report, essay or computer document about the person you interviewed.
4. A poster or collage that illustrates things families can do together instead of watching television.
5. A scrapbook or notebook about books people in the family have read and talked about together.
6. A family scrapbook of special events; birthday book; holiday book; or any other family journal that was created by two or more family members.
7. A written poem or story not to exceed two pages (one page equals one side of the paper).

### Division Rules:

Exhibits should be mounted or put in binder/folder for display.

## Division F – Creative Writing

### Class No:

1. A handwritten “commonplace book.”
2. A scrapbook or notebook of original poetry including at least one of the following “found poem”, “nature poem”, cinquain, “telephone or vertical poem” or any other original poem.
3. A poster about proper email “etiquette.”
4. A personal essay about why you keep a journal or diary. Journals and diaries **should not** be entered in the fair.
5. A handmade “few kind words book.”
6. Any other piece of original creative writing (poem, short story, essay, or play).
7. An original book review about your favorite book.
8. An original cover illustration for one of your favorite books.
9. A second piece of original creative writing.
10. A play script based on a favorite book.
11. A game (board or trivia) with detailed directions based on a favorite book.
12. A story board illustrating an original story.

### Division Rules:

Loose pages should be displayed in booklet form; i.e. binder or folder.

## Division G – Scrapbooking

### Class No:

#### *Traditional Scrapbooking techniques:*

1. 3-5 pages done during the current year.
2. 6-10 pages done during the current year.
3. Completed scrapbook.

#### *Computer or digital techniques:*

4. 3-5 pages done during the current year.
5. 6-10 pages done during the current year.
6. Completed scrapbook.

#### *Other entries:*

7. Poster (14”x22”) showing scrapbooking techniques.
8. Fold out scrapbooking item.
9. Scrapbooking calendar – current year.
10. Any articles not listed above.

Division Rules:

- Open to youth enrolled in Scrapbooking Project.
- All scrapbooking entries pages must include journaling.
- All entries must include your name on the project.
- Pages are counted as each side equals one page.
- Traditional Scrapbooking Techniques: Using all hand items (cut outs, stickers, etc.) and design pages by hand.
- Computer or Digital Techniques: Pages design using a computer program
- Four exhibits allowed in this division.
